Let's create Apartheid Free Zones in Finland!

You, your company, event, or community now have the opportunity to actively support the Palestinian struggle for human rights and freedom. Get to know the Apartheid Free Zone campaign and join us!

In Finland the campaign is organized by Sumud – The Finnish Palestine Network.

What is an Apartheid Free Zone?

An Apartheid Free Zone (AFZ) is a space actively building solidarity and supporting the Palestinian struggle for freedom and human rights.

An Apartheid Free Zone publicly declares its participation in the campaign and actively seeks ways to sever ties with entities that support the Israeli apartheid regime. AFZ engages in targeted boycotts set by the BDS movement – including cultural and academic boycotts – and continues boycotting until Israel adheres to international law and principles of human rights. AFZ promotes anti-racism and equality, and rejects the conflation of criticism of the Israeli state with antisemitism.

Visitors to an Apartheid Free Zone can enjoy their time with a clear conscience, knowing that the space they are in actively opposes the Israeli apartheid regime and the genocide of Palestinians.

A shop, café, library, university, museum, art gallery, concert venue, social space, or public administration space can declare itself an Apartheid-Free Zone.

The Apartheid Free Zone is a global BDS campaign aimed at getting companies and communities to support the targeted boycotts and sanctions imposed by the Palestinian-led BDS movement. Hundreds of spaces across Europe have declared themselves Apartheid-Free Zones.

How can our company or space become an Apartheid Free Zone?

Any company or space can become an Apartheid Free Zone (AFZ). An Apartheid Free Zone commits to:

- 1) the principles of the international BDS movement and targeted boycotts, including answering new BDS calls for targeted boycotts in the future.
- 2) the cultural and academic boycott of Israel as defined by the BDS movement (PACBI)
- 3) to act in an anti-racist manner.

In addition, the Apartheid Free Zone:

- 4) publicly declare itself an Apartheid Free Zone
- 5) affix a sticker to its premises stating that it is an Apartheid Free Zone
- 4) is added to a list on the sumud.fi website showing all Apartheid Free Zones (name of the space and city).
- 5) is added to the global AFZ list on the www.bdsmovement.net website (name of the space and city).

What if we make a mistake?

Everyone can make mistakes. If it turns out that you've accidentally purchased or sold products on the boycott list or supported the Israeli apartheid in any way, the most important thing is to correct the mistake. The campaign aims to give every space the opportunity to make its operations more ethical and thus support the Palestinian struggle for human rights. It's better to join the campaign and make a mistake than not to support the campaign at all.

What should the Apartheid Free Zone boycott?

Apartheid Free Zones boycott companies, products, and brands targeted by the BDS movement's targeted boycott. The boycott targets change over time, as some boycott campaigns are won and as others get added as new targets. You will be updated about these changes with our newsletter. Below is a list of the current BDS targets:

AFZs must boycott the following products and companies:

- Products, vegetables, and fruits coming from Israel or Israeli illegal settlements

AFZs should boycott these companies if a reasonable alternative exists. The Apartheid-Free Zone supports BDS movement pressure campaigns against these companies:

- Google and Amazon (US)
- Airbnb/Booking/Expedia
- Disney
- Teva Pharmaceutical Industries

Many other companies support Israeli apartheid in one way or another. Doesn't AFZ boycott all of them?

The strategy of the BDS movement is to target boycotts, pressure, and sanctions on specific companies and products to have the greatest possible impact. Apartheid Free Zones lend support to these targeted boycotts and campaigns. You can read more about the effectiveness of targeted boycotts from www.bdsmovement.net.

We encourage and assist Apartheid Free Zones in boycotting other products and companies that participate in Israeli apartheid to the extent of their capabilities.

What is cultural and academic boycott?

The Palestinian Campaign for the Academic and Cultural Boycott of Israel (PACBI) declared a boycott against Israeli academic institutions and cultural institutions in 2004.

The cultural boycott is a response to Israeli cultural institutions' efforts to maintain and normalize Israel's illegal occupation, Palestinian colonization, and apartheid. Apartheid-Free Zones do not organize cultural events funded by Israel or visibly supportive entities. Apartheid-Free Zones also do not participate in activities that support the normalization of apartheid and human rights violations. The boycott applies to institutions, not individual Israelis.

The academic boycott aims to sever ties with Israeli universities and other academic institutions. Israeli universities are involved in maintaining Israel's illegal occupation and apartheid and participate in, among other things, developing tools used by the military and systematically discriminating against Palestinians. Apartheid-Free Zones do not collaborate with Israeli academic institutions.

What is the BDS Movement?

BDS is a Palestinian-led global movement aimed at cutting economic support from the Israeli apartheid government. BDS stands for boycott, divestment, and sanctions. The BDS movement is based on a simple principle: Palestinians are entitled to the same human rights as everyone else. BDS draws inspiration from the struggle against South African apartheid and the associated boycotts.

The Finnish BDS movement is part of the Finnish Palestine Network Sumud.

What is apartheid?

Apartheid is the institutionalized system of racial segregation and oppression. It got its name from the apartheid policies practiced in South Africa in the 20th century ('Apartheid' means separateness in the Afrikaans language).

The UN Convention of 1976 defines apartheid crimes as actions aimed at creating and maintaining domination by one racial group over another. Apartheid involves the systematic oppression of a racial group.

Inhumane actions include:

- Denial of the right to life, including killings or causing serious physical or mental harm through torture, degrading treatment, or restriction of freedom.
- Arbitrary arrest and detention
- Population transfer
- Enforced labor/slavery
- Persecution of a group
- Enforced disappearance
- Prevention of participation in political, social, economic, and cultural life of the country.

Amnesty International and other human rights organizations recognize Israel's segregation policies as apartheid and crimes against humanity. Apartheid crime is one of the most serious international crimes.
